#ArmoryArtsChallenge: Cartoon Doodles from Memory

Materials

This activity is quite simple. You just need **something to draw on** (paper, white-board, cement floor, drawing tablet, it's yours to decide) and **something to draw with** (chalk, crayon, marker, pen, you name it).

Instructions

- Draw as many popular cartoon characters as possible from memory in 10 minutes.
- No cheating. Do NOT be tempted to look at ANY references.
- Forget about details. Be quick & loose.
- Focus on head and face, or try the whole body if you're feeling ambitious.
- Some may look a little "off," but that's part of the fun of this activity.
- It's not about being "good," it's about you
 getting a good sense of your own style through
 this exercise, it might not look too much like the
 character, but it will give you a good sense about
 how you draw and what makes your style unique.
- You'll notice your own style emerge, which is really valuable, if you can identify your own style, you can use it in your art.
- You'll probably create new characters without even meaning to!
