WHAT YOU WILL NEED ...




HAMMER



NAILS



2 PICTURE HOOKS



LEVEL



TAPE MEASURE



BLUE TAPE OR



PENCIL

1. FIRST WE WILL FIND THE HEIGHT THAT THE PAINTING WILL HANG ON THE WALL.

TO DO SO, MEASURE THE HEIGHT OF YOUR ARTWORK.

THEN DIVIDE THAT MEASUREMENT IN HALF.




2. NEXT, LOOK AT THE BACK.

MEASURE THE DISTANCE BETWEEN THE HANGING HARDWARE AND TOP OF THE PIECE.

WE ARE USING D RINGS IN THIS EXAMPLE

SUBTRACT THAT NUMBER FROM HALF OF THE HEIGHT.



D RING


How To Hang Art

3 TAKE THAT TOTAL AND ADD THAT TO 58" (EVE LEVEL)
THIS MEASUREMENT IS GOING TO TELL US THE
HEIGHT THAT WE WILL NAIL IN OUR PICTURE
HOOKS.

2" + 58" = 60"


4. NOW THAT YOU KNOW THE HEIGHT OF YOUR PIECE, YOU ARE GOING TO MEASURE THE WIDTH BETWEEN DRINGS.



5, ONCE YOU'VE GATHERED YOUR LENGTH AND WIDTH, IT'S TIME TO PUT THOSE TWO MEASUREMENTS ONTO THE WALL.

MARK YOUR TWO POINTS WITH A PENCIL OR BLUE TAPE.

USE A LEVEL TO MAKE SURE THEY ARE STRAIGHT.



60" FROM FLOOR WALL 6" ACROSS

6 THEN GENTLY HAMMER IN YOUR PICTURE HOOKS

7. FINALLY, PUT YOUR FRAME INTO PLACE AND MAKE SURE IT'S LEVEL!
